

# Make a QUIVER & ARROWS to be KATNISS

from *The Hunger Games*



## YOU WILL NEED:

- ✓ Empty Pringles tube
- ✓ Black paper
- ✓ Pencil
- ✓ Glue/double-sided tape
- ✓ Ruler
- ✓ Silver foil or silver paint
- ✓ Foil takeaway lids x 2 (you can buy a pack of 10 from Poundland for £1)
- ✓ Black elastic or black ribbon (available from supermarkets)
- ✓ Scissors
- ✓ Sellotape
- ✓ Plastic bow and arrows (also available from Poundland)


1. Paint the Pringles tube silver – or cover it with tin foil. With a ruler and pencil, draw out five separate 2.5 x 21cm pieces of black paper and cut them out. Alternatively, colour in five strips of white paper with black pen.




2. Glue the strips vertically around the tube, evenly spaced.



3. To make the arrows – cut six separate 20 x 1cm strips from the takeaway lids. Glue the strips together in pairs, to make three individual double strips.



4. To make the arrowheads – cut six separate 6 x 10cm strips of takeaway lid. Glue the strips together in pairs again, to make three double strips. Then cut a 'V' shape up from the bottom edge. Repeat the 'V' shape at the other end. Cut lines in from the outside edge to the middle to create a feathering effect.



5. Tape an arrowhead to the end of each of the longer strips from step 3. Tape them to the inside walls of the tube.



6. Push a sharp pencil through the top and bottom of the tube – you can do this safely by placing Blu Tack underneath where you will push your pencil – and push through a length of black elastic. Knot each end, so you can hang your quiver and arrows over your shoulder.



Add your copy of *The Hunger Games* and your outfit is complete!
